

LESSON #8 - FISHING BY FAITH - LUKE 5: 4-11

COMING TO THE WATERS - We live in a scientific, logical world. But when the Lord tells us to COME TO THE WATERS, He offers a refreshing change...the ability to move forward with logic and the added component of FAITH.

THE PRAYER - Dear Lord, how dry our lives would be if You had never extended the invitation to COME TO THE WATERS. Thank You for placing the miraculous into our hearts and lifting us up from the mundane. We praise Your Name in Jesus. Amen.

PARCHED HEARTS - ILLUSTRATION - In 1995, a fishing boat began to sink in the rough, cold waters off Vancouver Island, leaving two men in a life raft. They thought they were safe until they realized that their raft was tied to the sinking boat by a nylon rope. When their ship would finally go down, their raft was going to be pulled under. Neither man had a knife to cut the rope, so, for an hour, the two men alternated chewing the rope. One man lost a tooth in the frantic gnawing. Minutes before the ship sank, the men finally chewed through the rope and survived.

THOUGHT: I think those fellows paint a pretty accurate picture of the world. Our sinful world is _____. Even more importantly, each of us who live in this world is sinking. We look around for some way to free ourselves from the danger, but we're trapped. The only difference between us and those men, is we cannot _____ ourselves from the sins that have trapped us. If we are to be saved; if our lives are to have purpose, it is only through the intervention of Jesus. He will, if we listen, enable us to FISH BY FAITH.

FIRST APPLICATION - Almost 2,000 years ago on the Sea of Galilee, a fisherman learned how Jesus could change his life. FISHING BY FAITH, Peter found that his world and his life had new meaning. The questions which follow are taken from the fifth chapter of Luke.

SCRIPTURE SEARCH - HUMANKIND'S THIRST (Luke 5) - Because of a large crowd which was following Him, Jesus had borrowed one of the fishing boats while the fishermen were cleaning their nets. From that floating pulpit, He had instructed the people. We pick up the narrative after Jesus had finished His message.
