

## LESSON #9 - THE WATER OF WITNESS - 1 KINGS 18: 36-39

**COMING TO THE WATERS** - There are times when we feel inferior as Christians. Nevertheless, the Lord has promised to be with us, and He blesses those who hear His invitation to COME TO THE WATERS. Our lesson, the WATER OF WITNESS, shows how God gives us confidence to proclaim Jesus.

**THE PRAYER** - Dear Lord, there are millions of souls who have turned their backs to You. Allow each of us, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to boldly turn them to the Savior Who urges "all who are thirsty to COME TO THE WATERS."

**PARCHED HEARTS - ILLUSTRATION** - The tourist to Australia wanted to go swimming in the beautiful lagoon. Showing discretion, he asked a native, "Are there any alligators in this river?" "No, not a single one," was the reply. The visitor, stepping into the water, asked again, "If there are no alligators, what are those gray forms I see in the water? Are you sure there are no alligators?" "Certainly," replied his man who was standing on the bank. "I promise you there are no alligators down there. Those gray forms you see are the sharks who have chased the alligators away."

**THOUGHT:** Like that fellow who wanted to go swimming, there are many Christians who want to \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus. Unfortunately, when they get ready to dive in, they're afraid they'll make fools of themselves.

**FIRST APPLICATION** It's human nature to be fearful of what others might think. After all, we don't want to jeopardize our social standing, or put ourselves at risk. In contrast to this fear of the sharks, Scripture points out that witnessing to the Savior is a job which is of \_\_\_\_\_. God has provided numerous Biblical examples which show that He wants us to put away our fears rather than our witness. Let's take a look at one of those examples which comes from 1 Kings 18. Please answer the questions which follow.

**THIRST FOR AN ANSWER:** Pastors and laymen might be jealous of Elijah's ability to call down fire from the sky. We could easily boast, "If I could perform such a miracle, I would be glad to bear witness to the Lord. I wouldn't be afraid." Surprisingly, God has given us the ability to "do" miracles. They are not miracles like Elijah, but if that prophet were brought into our world, what would he say about?

It doesn't make any difference what kind of miracle He uses, He wants His people to witness, to invite people to "Come to the waters." He wants us to let HIM take care of the alligators.

**2. SCRIPTURE SEARCH - DEEP DRINKING** There are many other situations where God's people were up against the alligators. Look at these passages and see what God's witnesses said to the alligators: (The passages are all taken from the book of Acts)

**QUESTION** - The early church felt it was their job, under all circumstances, to share Jesus. They became, by the Spirit's power, the WATER OF WITNESS that the Spirit used to lead others to Jesus.

**THOUGHT & ILLUSTRATION:** - In the 1850's, one of God's faithful missionaries, Allen Gardiner, suffered many physical difficulties and hardships as he served the Savior. His witness continued as he said, "While God gives me strength, failure will not daunt me." He died of starvation and disease at the age of 57, while serving on an island off the southern tip of South America. His diary recorded days of hunger, thirst, and loneliness. Yet, the WATER OF WITNESS had sustained him as the last entry, written with a shaking hand, said "I am overwhelmed with a sense of the goodness of God."

**A FINAL STORY:** Bold, witnessing Christians are used by the Lord to accomplish His purposes. We dare not let our fears get in the way of our Gospel proclamation. We dare not be like: Rosasio Murat of Valencia, Spain. Rosasio saved her money for twelve years until she could buy her life's dream - a sailboat. That boat sits in her backyard. Why? "I'm terrified of the water," said the lady.
