

## LESSON #11 - DELIVERING WATERS - EXODUS 14: 22-28

**COMING TO THE WATERS** - Abraham Lincoln once said he had been forced to his knees because he had nowhere else to go. Many of us have experienced that feeling. We know, as Christians that God will send DELIVERING WATERS which take us, through our problems, to safety.

**THE PRAYER** - Dear Lord, there are times when we feel that we are at the end of our rope. Although we always ask for Your protection, especially in these times, deliver us. Grant that we hear Your invitation to COME TO THE WATERS so that we might be saved. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

**PARCHED HEARTS - ILLUSTRATION** - Most of the stories I tell are true...this one isn't. It begins with a flash flood and volunteers risking their lives to save stranded victims. One old man was up to his knees in the fast-rising waters when a rowboat came. "Hop in, we'll save you!", they said. "No thanks, the Lord will provide," was his reply. A short while later, a motor boat was sent to save the old fella. By now the waters were at his waist, but again he declined assistance, saying: "No thanks, the Lord will provide." Eventually, the water was up to his chin, and a helicopter was dispatched. Over a loudspeaker, the call went out: "Grab the ladder, this is your last chance!" "Thanks anyway, but I don't need you, the Lord will provide," came the calm reply. Before the helicopter landed, the old man was standing before the entrance to heaven, mad as could be. He yelled at St. Peter, "I remember being in trouble, praying up a storm, so why did you let me drown?" St. Peter looked at him, shook his head, and explained: "We provided two boats and a helicopter. What more do you want?"
