

LESSON #12 - WASHED CLEAN - 2 KINGS 5: 9-16

COMING TO THE WATERS - We are WASHED CLEAN by God's grace (note: we are talking about undeserved kindness here, not the Means of Grace, i.e., Word and Sacrament). That grace can come to us in the most unusual of places: the Jordan River, a Bethlehem stable or a Baptismal font. Whichever way grace arrives, it is God's way of inviting us to "COME TO THE WATERS."

THE PRAYER - Dear God, even as we acknowledge our sin and lost condition, we recognize that Your grace has made a wonderful and healing change in our lives. Make us into thankful and obedient children who, having COME TO THE WATERS, are willing to share them so that others are WASHED CLEAN. In the Name of our Savior, we ask it. Amen.

PARCHED HEARTS - ILLUSTRATION - In one location of central Turkey there are hot and cold springs found, which bubble up, side by side. For centuries, women have made use of this gracious gift by bringing their laundry. They boil their clothes in the hot springs and then rinse them in the cold. A tourist to that country, watching this procedure commented to his guide: "This is fantastic! These women must be extremely thankful to God for graciously supplying hot and cold water for their use" The guide replied, "You might think that is the case, sir. But most of the time the women complain because they have to bring their own soap."
